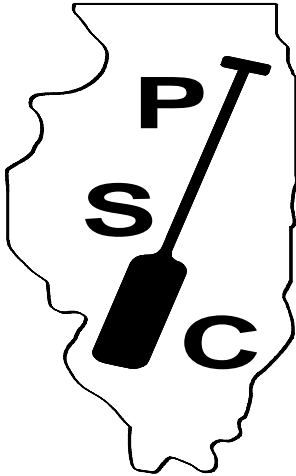

Your input is needed...

The following is an excerpt from the Rules for PSC trips that have been adopted for the 2005 paddling season. The changes regard PFDs and alcoholic beverages. The previous rules and the revised rules are shown below. The complete list of PSC Rules/Guidelines will be published in the 2005 Directory (or are available by request from the PSC Secretary).

The Officers and Board encourage comments from members and will revisit the decision to continue to use these rules or revise them at the end of the 2005 paddling season. Any member that has any comment or suggestion concerning these or any of the rules, please contact any officer or board member. There is also a forum for discussion of club matters at the PSC website, www.prairiestatecanoeists.org.

Old Rules:

- Each canoe will have a Coast Guard approved PFD Type I, II, or III (life vest) for EACH person in your canoe. CHILDREN 13 & UNDER MUST WEAR A PFD AT ALL TIMES. **It is strongly recommended that all members wear PFDs while on the water.**
- No outboard motors or radios are allowed on club trips. Alcoholic beverages are not to be consumed while on the water.

2005 Rules:

- Federal law requires that a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD) be on board for each person in the boat, and that all children 13 years old and younger wear a PFD at all times while on the water. PFDs must be worn at all times on PSC trips except when, at the discretion of the trip leader, the temperature and water levels allow for a relaxation of this rule.
- Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed for the duration of the trip, that is, from arrival at the put-in until after the take-out.

Where's the DIRECTORY???

The Mazon River is truly one of the 'GEMS' found in rare undeveloped areas within a short drive of the Chicago suburban area. This is rated 'Advanced Beginner' because there is a potential of the one Class I rapid and there many riffles that require maneuvering skills above a 'Beginner' status. The trip and the skill level required are dependant on the water level. In the past we have had everything between barely enough water to scrape through, to flood stage — this is to be expected for this unspoiled, undeveloped Illinois stream. We have to contend with the change in access since the bridge replacement in 2000, so we still need everyone to call us since the put-in parking is tight and a walk to the river. We always keep a small group. If water level is too low, we will paddle the DuPage River instead.

A wonderful opportunity to tune up your moving water skills on a fun and forgiving stretch of the DuPage River. Review strokes and moving water maneuvers like ferrys, eddy turns and peel outs. You must have taken the IP Training or have previously had some formal paddling instruction. Class size will depend on the number of instructors available. Scouting Northeastern Iowa Rivers
We will be trying out sections of the Wapsipinicon, Maquoketa, Volga, Turkey and/ or Upper Iowa rivers. The difficulty levels of these streams vary widely depending on water levels and previous flood damage, so no correct level can be given. However, we will be bringing one large tandem canoe and lots of cutting tools as well as requisite lines, poles, floats and other devices to ensure that everyone with a bit of a sense of humor can get through safely.

Participants may come for one day, for several days, or for the whole shebang. Just let me know.

Camping or motel-ing will be available. Please contact Al Donaldson by email (alandonaldson@sprintmail.com) prior to the trip so that details can be sent. Maps and directions, as well as motel and campground information, will be emailed to participants. Approximate schedule (again, depending on weather, river levels and the attitude of Mother Nature):

Date: Wednesday, April 13- Wapsipinicon River north of Independence; Put in: Sigglekov Park; Take out: Littleton or Independence

Date: Thursday, April 14- Maquoketa River ; Location not set yet

Date: Friday, April 15- Volga River; Put in: Fayette, IA; Take out: Volga River State Recreation Area

Date: Saturday, April 16- Turkey River; put in and take out to be determined. (Note: the Turkey River suffered from the floods last May, and with the relatively light use that it gets, some sections were still in rather awful shape last September. Set aside Sunday, April 24th for the Illinois Paddling Council's Annual Spring Kickoff Trip which will take place this year on the Pecatonica, in support of efforts to develop the Pecatonica Water Trail. We will paddle 7 miles, from Brewster Landing to West McConnell Road Bridge. Bring a PFD, lunch, and dump clothes in a dry bag. River levels can be high in the spring. Insurance fee will apply.

How to get to Brewsters Landing, from Chicago area. Take Interstate 90 to first Rockford exit, which will be for Rte. 20 bypass.; take Rte. 20 bypass to Rte. 20 and go West toward Freeport; take Rte. 20 bypass around Freeport to the Rte 26 exit and go North on Rte. 26; turn West on Winslow Rd which is the last road before the Wisconsin border.

The shuttle from Brewsters Landing: Go back east to Basswood Rd and go South; follow Basswood Rd to Old Mill Rd; turn right on Old Mill Rd and follow road to stop sign at Orangeville Rd; turn right on Orangeville and left just before the bridge.

(Also see trip listing for Sunday, May 1—Join us for one or both days and/or camping overnight at Kankakee River State Park if there is enough interest and prior notice.) We will paddle from the IN/IL state line to Momence. This is a really nice trip and it is close to home. The view at the put-in is rather amazing. When you look upstream you see the Kankakee River Ditch in Indiana that was engineered by the US Army Corps of Engineers. When you look downstream, you see the natural curves and shoreline to the portion in Illinois. The stretch has some cottages on it but is usually quiet. **Directions:** The put-in is at the intersection of State Line Road and the River at the North side (DO NOT try to access this from the south—the bridge is closed!). You may access State Line Road from IL RT 17. Go south of RT 17 approximately 3 miles to the closed bridge at

the river. There is a large gravel parking lot on the left. Carshift at 10:00 am; please call/e-mail if you plan to attend, especially if you want to camp.
