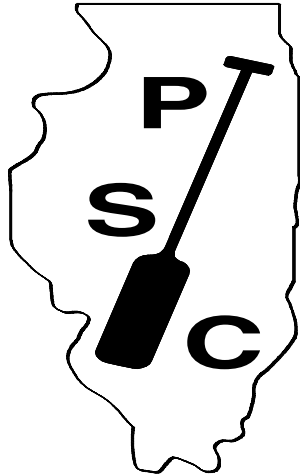

Ralph Frese inducted into the Illinois Outdoor Hall of Fame

On Saturday, March 4, 2006 Ralph Frese was inducted into the Illinois Outdoor Hall of Fame. Ralph was one of the Charter Members of Prairie State Canoeists. He has been involved with the canoeing community and various conservation projects for many years. When you see or talk to Ralph again congratulate him on achieving this honor.

The following was taken from a press release on the Illinois Conservation Foundation web site:

Ralph Frese, Niles - Known as "Mr. Canoe," Ralph Frese is a fourth generation blacksmith, who began building canoes in his blacksmith shop for his scout troop. Frese turned his passion for canoe building and paddling the waterways of Illinois into a successful canoe-building business in Chicago. Frese is well known for his work on behalf of conservation efforts on the Fox River in northeast Illinois and is the founder of the annual Des Plaines River Canoe Marathon. In 1973, he built two 21-foot early Algonquin birch bark canoes and re-enacted the Marquette and Joliet expedition of 1673.

Frese is a renowned spokesman and lecturer on the role of the canoe in Illinois history and is one of the leading advocates for water trails and waterway protection and enhancement in the nation. Frese is a recipient of numerous conservation and environmental achievement awards including recognition by the **American Canoe Association** as its first recipient of the group's **Legends of Paddling** award.

Join us for this skill building session with American Canoe Association certified instructors, under the supervision of Training Coordinators Tom Lindblade and Tom Richardson. No previous experience is necessary. Focus will be on safety, efficient paddling, basic strokes and maneuvers on flat water. You will have the opportunity to videotape your paddling so you can review your technique. Bring your boat (canoe or kayak), PFD, paddle, dump cloths and a lunch. (A small number of extra boats and equipment can be made available on request.) This session is sanctioned by the American Canoe Association (ACA). If you are a member, fees will include \$5.00 for materials and \$10.00 for instruction. If you are not a member of the ACA, an additional \$10.00 is required. (To join the ACA, log on to www.acanet.org). You must contact Bill Kessler, preferably by email, to reserve your place in this event and receive additional instructions. Be sure to indicate whether you paddle a canoe or a kayak. This session, or an equivalent, is required in order to take the Moving Water training.

This has allowed us to greatly expand both the quality and quantity of our Instructional offerings, and has done a lot to raise the level of paddling and safety education in the club. We hope that more of our membership will enroll in the Instructor Certification Workshop that Marge Cline and I are offering at College of DuPage Enrollment information is below. Keep in mind that PSC has a program for reimbursing the ACA dues for Instructors: You can call the Field Studies Program at COD at 630-942-2356 Canoeing: ACA Canoe/Kayak Instr. Cert. Wrkshp NEW* Gain instructor certification at the Basic River level in either canoes or kayaks. The Instructor Development Workshop (April 7 to 9) explores ACA teaching methods, demonstrates teaching and paddling skills, and offers feedback. The certification exam (May 6 and 7) allows students to demonstrate teaching skills and model paddling skills. Candidates who achieve the highest level of certification are able to demonstrate strong

Aug 6 Badfish Creek/Yahara River, WI

Sunflowers in bloom in a farmer's field. Goldfinches, green heron, giant blue heron, sandhill cranes and a bald eagle (which I've now sighted twice) near the confluence of the Badfish and the Yahara. **George Stenitzer**

Aug 13 Pecatonica River

There were only 6 people and 6 boats on this trip. The weather was threatening and took real courage to travel that far to paddle for 2 hours. Gas prices, regular, were very high, \$2.60 in Freeport and \$2.80 in Chicago area. Prior to the paddle waiting for the crowd to show up, I walked all over Brewster Landing picking up (a few) plastic bottles, trash, and alum cans. The West McConnell Road Bridge looked to be clean of liter. Brewster Landing is

the only usable cement public boat ramp in Stephenson County.

We launched at 1:00pm. One-fourth mile downstream was our first challenge. The river turned sharply right and fast. The outside curve was shallow. You had to stay on the inside of the curve. Everyone made it thru. From there on, it was smooth paddling. There were a few ripples at the old Fisher Mill Dam about 6 miles downstream. The water depth at the ripples was 18 inches, measured with my paddle. Al and Joe retrieved a large plastic barrel from the brush and sent it free to float downstream. Al and Lee rescued a tire with rim from a snag and sent it free to float downstream. Lee said that this tire was sent free south of Browntown on the June 27 paddle! We talked, shared stories and had a good time. The river banks are mostly mud and steep. The river is 50 to 100 feet wide and 3 to 5+ feet deep. Paddling is great exercise. It's a good thing. For more info, see 'trip 1' (7 miles) at www.paddlethepec.com Browntown, WI to Brewster Landing, via the Pecatonica River, is 12 miles. Lee Butler

Aug 27 Sugar River, WI

The first 11 miles of the trip (Brodhead to Avon), in spite of quite low water (161 cfs and .47 gage height at the Brodhead gage) was clear of stream-blocking deadfall, and plenty of depth was present. This is a relatively remote section, with good wildlife viewing and relatively little "civilization."

The final 4 miles (Avon to Nelson Road), through the "Avon Bottoms," was definitely interesting, with plenty of huge strainers and log jams. Extremely remote river section: only one bridge (just before the takeout) and few signs of people after the first few tenths of a mile. This section is definitely not recommended for beginners. Sept 10 Badfish Creek

Part of our group (the early bird riser group of 5) put in at 6:45 am and did the section of the creek farther upstream and met the rest of us at 9:00 am! Car shift was completed and we took off down the creek at approx. 10 am. The put in was interesting to say the least! Our boats had to be slid down a very steep bank and then carried through waist high switch grass (my ankles got cut up pretty good - boy that smarts!). One member took a tumble in a hole but was ok! The trip itself was wonderful - lots, and lots of tight turns, riffles, boulder dodging, and even some small rapids! Lunch was on a nice sand bar and some of our group went swimming and others just waded to cool off. We didn't see much wildlife but did see the great blue heron, geese, a few turtles and a small flock of sandhill cranes that took off and flew about 20 feet over our heads! One person had something very large jump off the bank into the water creating a wave with enough force to rock her boat scaring the living daylights out of her! Barb had a leopard frog that somehow ended up in her boat and took a ride with her to the end of the trip. All in all this was a fun trip that gave everyone lots of practice in boat handling while we played with the river. Melinda Tury
